Okti's operation in the past year faced the herculean challenge presented by the Covid Pandemic. Suffering & death on a level that had not been seen before in our lifetimes urged us to action while the pandemic's physical restrictions held us back.

Yet, Okti continued its crusade of rural healthcare to the best of its capacity; doctors across state boundaries served in their own locales, witnessing a necessary decline in elective surgeries & an increase in obstetric interventions. It was with careful planning & by working around the rules of lock down that Okti successfully carried out seven Surgical Camps in 2021, a testament to the commitment & solidarity of our team. Surgeons, anesthetists, and paramedics risked contracting the infection when they came into contact with patients who tested Covid Positive on several occasions.

Mr. Sibi Prakash from Direct Relief kindly donated oxygen concentrators & masks to Okti foundation during this time. These resources were deployed in different villages in Himachal Pradesh. Okti's torch bearer & raison d'etre, Dr. George Verghese, became a hero to the team. He contracted COVID-19 & was admitted to CMC Ludhiana in a critical state. He returned to the service of the rural community right out of recovery & operated despite being on oxygen through nasal prongs, an image which is sure to inspire several generations of doctors.

Okti would also like to take this moment to pay its respects to Dr. G. R. Bazliel, one of the founding members of Okti Foundation, whom we lost to natural causes in 2021. His empathy, experience, & commitment continue to be a cornerstone of this organization.

Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer amongst women in India. Team Okti is constantly taking steps to reach out to the people of remotest parts of our diverse country to spread awareness regarding its prevention, screening, treatment, and vaccination. The snow festival in Lahaul valley was recognized as one such opportunity. The team was also fortunate to deliver its services to the inmates of Tihar Jail in this context.

We are also proud to report that FOGSI Dr Duru Shah Community Service Award 2021 was conferred upon Okti Foundation at AICOG Indore in 2022. The Organization was also felicitated on 8th March 2021 by Delhi Medical Association for the extensive community work at IMA Bhawan Delhi.

DR PRABHUDAS HOSPITAL, TOTU, SIMLA, HIMACHAL PRADESH MARCH 3-5,2021

Totu is a suburb of Shimla city located 1950 meters above sea level with restricted access to even basic healthcare facilities. In the Corona virus pandemic, to help out local people with surgical grievances, Okti Foundation organised a Surgical Venture at Prabhudas Clinic & Nursing home with financial assistance from Suvidha Diagnostic Centre. Twenty successful surgeries were performed over the month of March 2021 by Dr Prabhudas, Dr Mandeep & team. These included laparoscopic surgeries like laparoscopic ovarian cystectomy, cholecystectomy etc., emergency procedures like amputation of gangrenous foot, hemorrhoidectomy for bleeding hemorrhoids, drainage of breast abscess were done. Elderly frail ladies with large uterine prolapse underwent vaginal hysterectomy. One 70-year-old female with suspected cancer of anal canal underwent wide excision and biopsy. All the patients were discharged in stable condition.

B: OKTI'S OTHER VENTURES TOWARDS RURAL WELL BEING

CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS INITIATIVE VILLAGE KHOKSAR, LAHAUL, HIMACHAL PRADESH MARCH 18, 2021

Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer amongst women in India. This dreaded disease kills at an alarming rate with an estimated one life lost every 8 minutes. Today, with medical and technical tools at hand no woman should have to die of cervical cancer. It goes without saying that the burden of this deadly, yet preventable cancer falls more on women who lack access to health services. We believe, with the three-pronged comprehensive approach, comprising of spreading awareness, screening (followed by treatment when needed), and vaccination, cervical cancer can be eliminated as a public health problem within a generation.

Okti foundation, the Community Outreach Program of Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Sant Parmanand Hospital, has been dedicated for a long time towards this cause. The team is constantly taking steps to reach out to the people in the remotest parts of India. The ongoing snow festival in Lahaul valley was recognized as one such opportunity, where overwhelming participation of women was observed. This high-altitude tribal community was isolated from rest of the world during harsh winter months usually till April until the opening of Atal Rohtang tunnel. The festival was organized by Sh. Markanda with support from local communities and was attended by Mrs Chandra Pardhan, Mr Manav Verma, SP, Lahaul and Dr TC Sharma.

On March 18, 2021, at sub-zero temperature, an awareness talk was delivered by Dr Sonal Bathla at the snow festival addressing the women and the adolescent girls present. The aim was to educate them about the prevalence of cervical cancer, its risk factors, symptoms and importance of vaccination and screening. The women were educated about the safe sex practices, importance of genital hygiene and when to seek medical help. The importance of cervical cancer screening was reinforced as early cervical cancer might not have any symptoms. The significance of menstrual hygiene and the means to practice the same were conveyed to the young girls. The talk was attended by more than 100 women and girls. The information was well comprehended by the audience. The concept of vaccination was welcomed too. Some women had queries which were satisfactorily addressed. They were encouraged to take part in phase two of the initiative, when screening will be conducted.

The program was appreciated by the community, which gives us the motivation to continue making efforts till we reach our goal.



CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS AND SCREENING INITIATIVE TIHAR JAIL, NEW DELHI April 8, 2021

With all the conviction, Okti foundation, the Community Outreach Program of Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Sant Parmanand Hospital, Delhi, is constantly taking steps to reach out to the people belonging to different sects of community for prevention of Cervical Cancer. One such part of community is the population of women living in jail. Though women inmates residing in Tihar Jail have access to the medical facility round the clock, cervical cancer screening is a project where in you need to impart information and awareness to the individual and then motivate her for screening.

On April 8, 2021, with due permission and in presence Senior Medical Officer CJ-6, Dr Shahida, an Awareness Talk was delivered by Dr Sonal Bathla, Consultant Gynaecologist and Secretary Okti Foundation at Tihar Jail, addressing the women. The talk was attended by more than 100 women. The aim was to educate them about the prevalence of cervical cancer, its risk factors, symptoms and importance of vaccination and screening. The women were educated about the safe sex practices, importance of genital hygiene and when to seek medical help. The importance of cervical cancer screening was reinforced as early cervical cancer might not have any symptoms. The information was delivered in both English and Hindi language which was well apprehended by the audience. Some women had queries which were satisfactorily addressed. They were encouraged to take part in screening and seek gynecological consultation in case of any complaints.

A total of 100 women were counselled, out of which 50 women were consulted and examined by Dr Shalu Jain, Dr Preeti Yadav, Ms Saira Bano, Ms Phuntsog Dolma and Ms Sweety. Out of these 25 women wanted cervical cancer screening. Cervical cytology samples were taken after due written consent. In 20% (n=5) of the samples, Bacterial Vaginosis was reported. The same was conveyed to the jail authorities and women were appropriately treated. No patient was found to have a suspicious cytology report. The samples were processed by Onquest Laboratories and financially supported by Pharmed Limited.

Following medical and surgical comorbidities were noted among the participating women and appropriate medical advice was given.
